


# BH4 Block 23 - Gentleman's Fancy

Color/shading options.

#### **Piecing & Cutting Notes:**

• The A and E squares for the setting triangles are over-sized to allow the completed block to be trimmed to size.

### **Cutting Instructions:**

9" Finished Block:

A - (2) squares - 41/4" x 41/4"

B - (1) square - 51/2" x 51/2

C - (6) squares - 3" x 3"

D - (1) square - 3½" x 3½"

E - (1) square - 4½" x 4½"

41/2" Finished Block:

A - (2) squares - 2¾" x 2¾"

B - (1) square - 3%" x 3%"

C - (6) squares - 1%" x 1%"

D - (1) square - 2" x 2"

E - (1) square - 3" x 3"

## All seams are a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " unless specified otherwise.

## **Assembly**

1. Cut the A and C squares once on the diagonal as shown to yield a total of (12) triangles. Cut the B and E squares twice on the diagonal as shown to yield a total of (4) triangles.





A and C squares


B and E squares

2. Join (2) C triangles to each side of (1) B triangle as shown. Press the seams in the direction of the C triangle. Make 4.







- 3. Join (1) A triangle to the top of the geese unit as shown. Press the seam to the A triangle. Make 4.
  - · Align the A triangle by folding the pinch-pleating long edge and pinch-pleating the center. Place the pleat on the point of the flying geese unit.



4. Join the (4) remaining C triangles to the sides of the D square. Press the seams to the C triangles.




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
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- 5. Lay out the units as shown.
  - The E triangles are over-sized to allow the block to be trimmed to size after it's complete.




6. Join the units to make three diagonal rows. Press the seams in the direction of the arrows - or press them open.



7. Join the rows to complete the block. Press the seams away from the center row - or press them open.

Trim the blocks as follows - align the ruler on the points of the C triangles joined to the D square.

- 9" block line up the 43/4" lines of the ruler to trim block to 91/2" x 91/2".
- 4½" block use the 2½" lines of the ruler to trim the block to 5" x 5".
