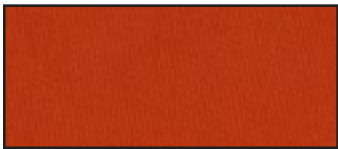

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Make templates for Center Square, Corner Triangle, Large Corner Square, Small Corner Square and Border Triangle as shown on page 3.

KEY	CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS
A	Centering design as shown, <i>fussy cut</i> : (4) Center Square Templates. Centering design as shown, <i>fussy cut</i> : (8) Small Corner Square Templates.
B	Centering design as shown, <i>fussy cut</i> : (16) Border Triangle Templates.
C	(2) 7-1/2" squares; subcut squares in half diagonally once to make (4) triangles.
D	Centering design as shown, <i>fussy cut</i> : (12) Corner Triangle Templates. Centering design as shown, <i>fussy cut</i> : (4) Large Corner Square Templates.
E	(1) 4-7/8" x 42" strip; subcut (7) Border Triangle Templates. Alternate triangles across strip to conserve fabric. (1) 5-3/8" x 42" strip; subcut (2) 5-3/8" squares and (2) Border Triangle Templates. Cut squares in half diagonally once to make (4) 5-3/8" triangles.
F	(8) 2" x 42" strips; sew short ends together. Subcut (4) 2" x 45-1/2" borders and (4) 2" x 28-1/2" borders.
G	(4) 2" x 31-1/2" borders.
H	FOR BINDING: (5) 2-1/4" x 42" strips, sew short ends together. (7) 1-3/4" x 42" strips; sew short ends together. Subcut (4) 1-3/4" x 43" borders and (4) 1-3/4" x 19" borders. (4) 2" squares.
I	(4) 1-3/4" squares. (2) 2-7/8" squares; cut squares in half diagonally once to make (4) triangles.

ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

2-1/2 yards backing fabric

Thread to match fabrics

Basic sewing supplies

Template plastic

Sewing machine

Rotary cutter, ruler and mat

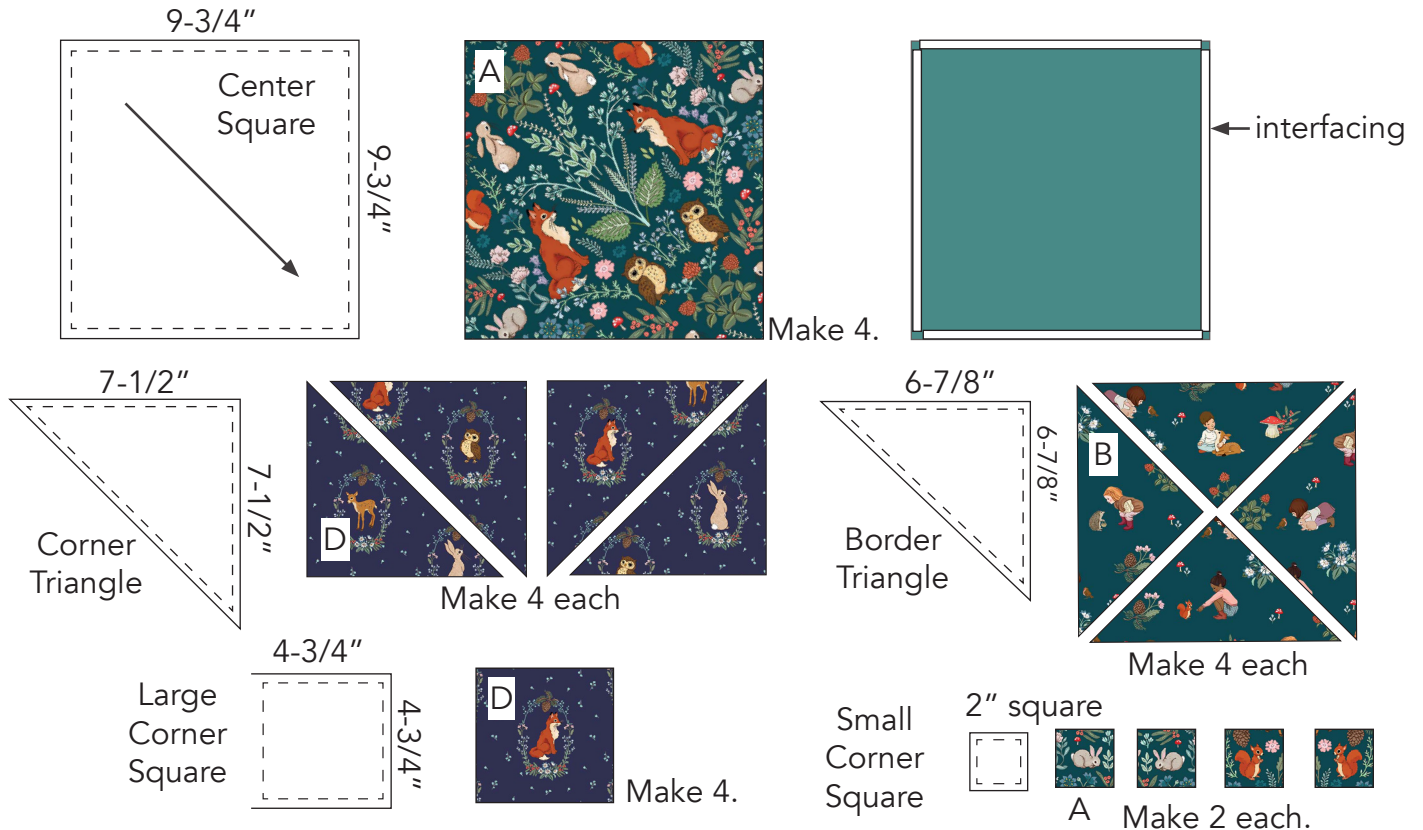
Optional: 1/4 yard lightweight fusible interfacing

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TEMPLATES FOR FUSSY-CUTTING

1. Make templates for the Center Square, Corner Triangle, Border Triangle, Large Corner Square and Small Corner Square, using the measurements given. Mark the seam-line 1/4" from the edges, if desired. Cut Templates from fabrics as shown. Center square is cut with arrow on the straight grain.

Optional: Cut (16) 1/4" x 9-1/4 strips from lightweight fusible interfacing. Fuse to seam allowance of center square to prevent bias edges from stretching during sewing.



QUILT CENTER

2. Sew (2) **A** center blocks together in pairs to make (1) half block. Make 2.

3. Sew (2) half blocks together to make quilt center. Make 1.



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CORNER TRIANGLE

4. Sew (1) **C** Corner Triangle and (1) **D** Corner Triangle together to make (1) square unit. Note orientation of print on **D** triangles.

5. Sew (2) **D** Corner Triangles to sides of square unit to make a **C/D** triangle unit. Make 4 triangle units as shown in Quilt Layout on page 5.

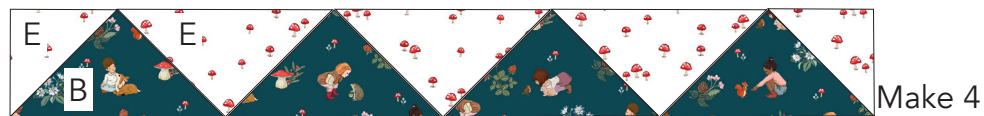

PATCHWORK BORDER

6. Sew together (4) **B** Border Triangles alternating with (3) **E** Border Triangles. Note orientation of print on **B** triangles. Sew (2) **E** 5-3/8" triangles to ends to make a rectangle. Make 4 borders as shown in Quilt Layout on page 5.



QUILT ASSEMBLY

7. Following the Quilt Layout on page 5, sew (2) **H** 1-3/4" x 19" borders to opposite sides of the quilt center. Sew (2) **I** 2-7/8" triangles to ends of (2) **H** 1-3/4" x 19" borders. Note orientation of triangles. Sew to remaining sides of the quilt center.

8. Sew (1) **C/D** corner triangle unit to each side of the quilt.

9. Sew (2) **F** 2" x 28-1/2" borders to sides of the quilt. Sew (2) **A** Small Corner Square Templates to ends of (2) **F** 2" x 28-1/2" borders. Sew to top and bottom of quilt.

10. Sew (2) **G** 2" x 31-1/2" borders to sides of quilt. Sew (2) **H** 2" squares to ends of (2) **G** 2" x 31-1/2" borders. Sew to top and bottom of quilt.

11. Sew (2) Patchwork Borders to sides of the quilt. Sew (2) **D** Large Corner Square Templates to ends of (2) Patchwork Borders. Sew to top and bottom of quilt.

12. Sew (2) **H** 1-3/4" x 43" borders to sides of quilt. Sew (2) **I** 1-3/4" squares to ends of (2) **H** 1-3/4" x 43" borders. Sew to top and bottom of quilt.

13. Sew (2) **F** 2" x 45-1/2" borders to sides of the quilt. Sew (2) **A** Small Corner Square Templates to ends of (2) **F** 2" x 45-1/2" borders. Sew to top and bottom of quilt.

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Quilt Layout



FINISHING: Layer quilt top, batting and backing together to form quilt sandwich. Baste and quilt as desired. Bind using five fabric **H** $2\frac{1}{4}"$ strips.
