

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Cutting Instructions:

Please read all instructions carefully before beginning. Strips are cut across the width of fabric (perpendicular to selvedges) unless otherwise stated. All seams are sewn with a 1/4" seam unless otherwise stated. Label all pieces.

From Fabric A:

1. Fussy cut panel 40 1/2" x 32 1/2" centering image.

From Fabric B:

1. Cut one 3 3/8" strip; subcut four 3 3/8" squares.

From Fabric C:

1. Cut one 5 1/4" strip; subcut two 5 1/4" squares.

From Fabric D:

1. Cut one 5 1/4" strip; subcut two 5 1/4" squares.

From Fabric E:

1. Cut four 2 12" strips; subcut two 2 1/2" x 36 1/2" strips and two 2 1/2" x 40 1/2" strips.

From Fabric F:

1. Cut one 5 1/4" strip; subcut two 5 1/4" squares.

From Fabric G:

- 1. Cut one 4 12" strip; subcut four 4 1/2" squares.
- 2. Cut seven 2 7/8" strips; subcut eighty 2 7/8" squares. Cut eight once on the diagonal to make sixteen triangles.

From Fabric H:

1. Cut one 5 1/4" strip; subcut two 5 1/4" squares.

From Fabric I:

1. Cut one 5 1/4" strip; subcut two 5 1/4" squares.

From Fabric J:

- 1. Cut six 2 1/4" strips for binding.
- 2. Cut one 5 1/4" strip; subcut two 5 1/4" squares.

From Fabric K:

1. Cut one 5 1/4" strip; subcut two 5 1/4" squares.

From Fabric L:

1. Cut one 5 1/4" strip; subcut two 5 1/4" squares.


From Fabric M:

1. Cut one 5 1/4" strip; subcut two 5 1/4" squares.

Piecing Instructions:

Note: Press seams as directed by arrows or instructions.

1. Draw a diagonal line across the back side of each 2 7/8" G square. Place one 5 1/4" C square right side up. Place two 2 7/8" G squares right side down in opposite corners, overlapping in the center as shown. Stitch 1/4" from either side of the line, cut apart on the drawn line. Press towards G to make two A Units. (Figure 1)



2. Pin one 2 7/8" G square in the corner of each A Unit as shown. Stitch 1/4" on either side of the drawn line. Cut apart on the line and press towards G, to make four Flying Geese Unit. Trim and square to 2 1/2" x 4 1/2". Make eight each of Fabric C, D, F, H, I, J, K, L, and M. (Figure 2)




3. Sew one 2 7/8" G triangle to opposite sides of 3 3/8" B squares. Press towards G, then sew a second pair of triangles to the remaining sides. Trim to 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" square. Set aside as the B Unit. (Figure 3)





Figure 4 Make 2 of each.

4. Sew one B Unit, two 4 1/2" G squares, four C Flying Geese units and two C, D, F, H, I, J, K, L and M Flying Geese Units together into a horizontal border as shown. Repeat to make two. Sew the remaining Flying Geese Units and B Units together to make two vertical borders. (Figure 4)

5. Sew 2 1/2" x 40 1/2" E borders to the top and bottom of the 40 1/2" x 32 1/2" A rectangle. Press towards E, then

- sew the 2 1/2" x 36 1/2" E borders to the sides. Press towards E.
- 6. Sew the Vertical Flying Geese borders to the sides of the quilt. Press towards E, then sew the horizontal borders to the top and bottom. Press towards E. (Quilt Diagram)

Finishing:

- 1. Press 108" backing well and trim to 60" x 52".
- Layer quilt, batting, and backing. Baste layers together.
- 3. Quilt as desired.
- 4. Trim layers even with quilt top squaring corners.
- 5. Join six 2 1/4" J binding strips with diagonal seams. Press seams open. Attach binding using your favorite method.
- 6. Make a label and sew to the back of quilt.
