

Wilmington Prints: A World of Possibilities

Please read all instructions carefully AND identify all fabrics before beginning.

All instructions include a 1/4" seam allowance and strips are cut selvage to selvage, unless stated otherwise.

1. Cut the following:

If using FAT CUTS, you may need to cut additional width-of-fabric strips.

Fabric A - PLEASE NOTE: Panels do not always print the size intended. For this pattern, panels have a coping border added then trimmed so they will fit the quilt correctly.

Fussy cut 1/4" beyond outside edges of 6 panels to approximately 11-1/2" square

Fabric B - Referring to the quilt image, fussy cut strips, the length of fabric parallel to selvage: (2) 5-1/2" x 78" and (2) 5-1/2" x 66" sewing machine stripe borders

Fabric C - Cut (1) 5" strip, subcut (8) 5" squares Cut (1) 4-1/2" strip, subcut (3) 4-1/2" squares and (8) 2-1/2" squares Cut (1) 2-1/2" strip, subcut (16) 2-1/2" squares

Fabric D - Cut (1) 5" strip, subcut (6) 5" squares Cut (1) 4-1/2" strip, subcut (4) 4-1/2" squares Cut (2) 2-1/2" strips, subcut (32) 2-1/2" squares Cut (8) 1-1/4" strips, subcut (12) 1-1/4" x 14" and (12) 1-1/4" x 12" strips

Fabric E - Cut (2) 3" strips, subcut (18) 3" squares

Fabric F - Cut (6) 2" strips, sewn together end to end and cut into (2) 2" x 60-1/2" and (2) 2" x 51-1/2" borders

Fabric G - Cut (2) 3" strips, subcut (24) 3" squares


Fabrics H and I - Cut (2) 2-1/2" strips, from one strip subcut (1) 2-1/2" x 21" strip

Fabric J - Cut (2) 2-1/2" strips Cut (7) 2-1/2" strips, subcut (1) 2-1/2" x 21" strip, (16) 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" pieces, and (64) 2-1/2" squares

Fabric K - Cut (2) 2-1/2" strips Cut (8) 2-1/2" strips (binding) Cut (5) 2-1/2" strips, subcut (1) 2-1/2" x 21" strip, (12) 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" pieces, and (48) 2-1/2" squares Fabric L - Cut (2) 5" strips, subcut (14) 5" squares and (1) 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" piece Cut (3) 3" strips, subcut (42) 3" squares Cut (3) 2-1/2" strips, subcut (27) 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" pieces Cut (2) 2-1/2" strips

2. Piecing Order:

1. Stitch **Fabric D** 1-1/4" x 12" strips to sides of 1 **Fabric A** panel. Trim strip ends even. Add 1-1/4" x 14" **Fabric D** strips to top and bottom of panel. *Trim bordered panel to 12-1/2"* square (unfinished). Make 6 **Block 1**.



Arrows indicate orientation of directional prints.

2. On the wrong side of all **Fabric L** 5" and **L** 3" squares, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner. Draw 2 lines, 1/4" on each side of first line.



Letters in italics indicate wrong side of fabric.

3. Arrange a marked **Fabric L** 5" square right sides together with a **Fabric C** 5" square aligning all edges. Stitch along the 2 outside lines. Cut along the center line. Press the 2 triangle sets open. Centering seam, trim each to 4-1/2" square. Make a total of 16 Unit 1a. In the same manner, make 12 Unit 1b with fabrics indicated.












Repeat 8 times for 16 units.

Unit 1a Make 16



4. Sew 1 each Fabrics H and J 2-1/2" x width of fabric strips together lengthwise. Make a half strip set with 2-1/2" x 21" strips. From these, cut 22 Unit 2a (2-1/2" x 4-1/2" unfinished). In the same manner, make 1-1/2 strip sets with **Fabrics I** and **K** strips and cut 20 Unit 2b.



Stripes indicate orientation of directional prints.


5. Stitch 1 each Fabrics L and K 2-1/2"x width of fabric strips together lengthwise. From this, cut 16 Unit 2c (2-1/2" x 4-1/2" unfinished). In the same manner, make 1 strip set with Fabrics J and L strips and cut 12 Unit 2d.



6. Sew 2 Unit 2a together, alternating fabrics as shown. Make a total of 11 Unit 3a (4-1/2" square unfinished). In the same manner, make 10 Unit 3b, 8 Unit 3c, and 6 Unit 3d with units indicated.




7. Arrange a marked **Fabric L** 3" square right sides together with a Fabric E 3" square aligning all edges. Stitch along the 2 outside lines. Cut along the center line. Press the 2 triangle sets open. Centering seam, trim each to 2-1/2" square. Make a total of 36 Unit 4a. In the same manner, make 48 Unit 4b with fabrics indicated.



8. Arrange 1 Fabric K **Ù**4a 2-1/2" square and 3 Unit U4a 4a in 2 rows. Stitch into U4a U4b U4h rows. Sew rows together. Unit 5a Unit 5b Make a total of 12 Unit 5a Make 12 Make 16 (4-1/2" square unfinished). In the same manner, make 16 Unit 5b with fabric and units indicated.


- 9. Draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of **Fabrics C** and **D** 2-1/2" squares. Draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of half the Fabrics J and K 2-1/2" squares, and a diagonal line in the opposite direction on the other half of the squares.
- 10. Arrange 2 marked **Fabric K** 2-1/2" squares on opposite corners of a Fabric C 4-1/2" square as shown. Stitch along marked lines. Trim seam allowances to 1/4". Press corners out. Repeat on remaining corners. Make a total of 3 Unit 6a (4-1/2" square unfinished).



11. In the same manner, make 4 Unit 6b.



12. Arrange a marked **Fabric K** 2-1/2" square on 1 end of a **Fabric L** 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" piece as shown. Stitch along marked line. Trim seam allowance to 1/4". Press corner out. Repeat on other end. Make a total of 12 Unit 7a (2-1/2 x 4-1/2 unfinished).



13. In the same manner, make 12 Unit 7b and 16 each Units 7c and 7d with fabrics indicated.



14. Sew 1 each Units 7a and 7b together as shown. Make a total of 12 Unit 8a (4-1/2" square unfinished). In the same manner, make 16 Unit 8b with units indicated.

15. Arrange 4 Units 1a, 2 Unit 3a, 1 Unit 3b, and 2 Unit 3c in 3 rows. Stitch into rows. Sew rows together. Make a total of 4 Block 2a (12-1/2" square unfinished). In the same manner, make 3 Block 2b with units indicated.







Block 2a - Make 4

16. Arrange 4 Units 5a, 1 Unit 6a, and 4 Unit 8a in 3 rows. Stitch into rows. Sew rows together. Make a total of 3 Block 3a (12-1/2" square unfinished). In the same manner, make 4 Block 3b with units indicated.






- 17. Refer to Quilt Layout (Page 4) for arrangement and placement of blocks and borders.
- 18. Arrange blocks in 5 rows. Stitch into rows. Sew rows together completing guilt center (48-1/2" x 60-1/2" unfinished).

19. Sew **Fabric F** 2" x 60-1/2" borders to right and left sides of quilt center. Add Fabric F 2"x 51-1/2" borders to top and bottom of quilt center.


20. Center Fabric B 5-1/2" x 78" borders on right and left sides of quilt center and Fabric B 5-1/2" x 66" borders on top and bottom of quilt center, referring to quilt image for positioning of stripe. Stitch 1/4" borders to sides starting detail and stopping 1/4" from corners of quilt center. \leftarrow Quilt Do not trim. Press В Center

> Letters in italics indicate wrong side of fabric. Arrows indicate orientation of directional prints.

21. Working with 1 corner at a time, fold the quilt right sides together so the outside edges of the borders line up. Using a 45-degree ruler, mark from the end of border seams to outer edges of borders. Stitch along marked line. Trim seam allowance to 1/4". Press corner seam open. Repeat on remaining corners.




- 22. The quilt measures approximately 61-1/2" x 73-1/2" (unfinished). Make backing (Fabric M) approximately 8" larger than the top.
- 23. Layer and baste top, batting, and backing together. Quilt as desired. Attach binding (Fabric K) and enjoy!!
