



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The Original **NON-SLIP** Ruler **NON-SLIP** Scrap Crazy






Cut four pieces to create a Crazy Patch block that finishes 6". All of the pieces can be cut from scraps or stack fabrics and cut multiples in a matter of minutes. Make a crazy quilt by embellishing the seams with your favorite embroidery stitches.

Instructions

Turn your scrap fabrics into beautiful quilts using this 4 template set. Construct a traditional 6 inch finished Crazy Patch block or use the templates in alternate combinations for a variety of different patterns.


1. Place your fabrics right side up on your cutting surface. Cut one of each template shape for each block in your quilt.

2. Arrange the fabric pieces as they will appear in the completed block, having the straight of grain side of the A template on the outside edge of the block. Fig. 1.


3. Stitch the A piece to the B piece matching the clipped corners for perfect positioning. Press the seam toward the darker fabric. Fig. 2.

4. Stitch the C and D pieces together as shown. Press the seam toward the darker fabric. Fig. 3.

5. Stitch the A/B unit to the C/D unit matching the clipped corners for perfect positioning. Press the seam to one side. Fig. 4












Alternate Shapes








How to Cut from a 6" Strip

This layout will result in mirror image blocks. Two will be right facing and 2 will be left facing. Note: By layering four different fabric strips, you can cut sixteen blocks out at once.

These pieces are cut mirror image by cutting from the back of the fabric.



- 1. Remove the selvedge edges from the end of the fabric strip.
- 2. Place the A and B templates as shown and make a vertical cut at the base of the B template. Cut out pieces A & B. Turn the remaining fabric over and cut the second B template from the back of the fabric.
- 3. Next cut pieces C & D from the fabric strip.
- 4. Turn the remaining section over and cut A, C & D from the back of the fabric.
