Throw/Twin Quilt: 59 1/2" x 77 1/2"



Wall Quilt: 48" x 48 3/4"

Please read all instructions carefully AND identify all fabrics before beginning. All instructions include a 1/4" seam allowance and strips are cut selvage to selvage, unless stated otherwise.

1. Cut the following for Throw Quilt:

Fabric B - Referring to the guilt image, fussy cut strips, the length of fabric parallel to selvage: (2) 4-1/2"x 79" and (2) 4-1/2"x 61" window sill stripe borders

Fabric C - Cut (1) 9-3/4" strip, subcut (1) 9-3/4" and (2) 9-1/2" squares Cut (2) 9-1/2" strips, subcut (8) 9-1/2" squares

Fabric D - Cut (1) 9-1/2" strip, subcut (4) 9-1/2" squares

Fabric E - Cut (2) 5-3/4" strips, subcut (8) 5-3/4" squares then cut in half diagonally twice 🔀 for 32 triangles

Fabric F - Cut (2) 6-7/8" strips, subcut (8) 6-7/8" squares

Fabric G - Cut (1) 5" strip, subcut (8) 5" squares

Fabric H - Cut (1) 9-7/8" strip, subcut (2) 9-7/8" squares, then cut in half diagonally 📝 for 4 triangles

Cut (7) 2" strips, sewn together end to end and cut into (2) 2" x 75" and (2) 2" x 60" borders

Fabric I - Cut (3) 5-3/8" strips, subcut (16) 5-3/8" squares, then cut in half diagonally only as shown for 32 triangles Cut (1) 5" strip, subcut (8) 5" squares


Fabric J - Cut (6) 1-1/4" strips, sewn together end to end and cut into (2) 1-1/4" x 67" and (2) 1-1/4" x 49" strips for flat piping

Fabric K - Cut (2) 5-3/8" strips, subcut (8) 5-3/8" squares, then cut in half diagonally only as shown for 16 triangles Cut (6) 2-1/4" strips, sewn together end to end and cut into (2) 2-1/4" x 63-1/2" and (2) 2-1/4" x 49" borders

Fabric M - Cut (2) 5-3/8" strips, subcut (10) 5-3/8" squares, then cut 4 in half diagonally only as shown and 6 in the opposite direction for 20 triangles

2. Piecing Order for Throw Quilt:

1. Stitch a Fabric H 9-7/8" triangle to each Fabric N triangle along their long edges to make 2 each






Stitch 4 Fabric E 5-3/4" triangles to sides of a Fabric G 5" square, Add 5-3/8" Fabric I triangles to all sides. Make a total

of 8 Block 2 (9-1/2" square unfinished).

Mark center of each side of the 9-3/4" Fabric C square. Trim corners from square, center mark to center mark on each corner as shown. Stitch 4 Fabric K 5-3/8" triangles to sides of the **Fabric C** square to complete 1 Block 3 (9-1/2" square unfinished).



4. Stitch 2 each Fabrics K and M 5-3/8" triangles to sides of a Fabric F 6-7/8" square as shown. Make a total of 4 Block 4





Block 4 - Make 4

(9-1/2" square unfinished). In the same manner, make 4 Block 5 with fabrics shown.

Draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of the Fabric I 5" squares as shown.

Letters in italics indicate wrong side of fabric.

6. Place a marked Fabric I square on a Fabric D 9-1/2" square as shown. Stitch along marked





line. Trim seam allowance to 1/4". Press corner out. Repeat on adjoining corner. Make 1 each Blocks 6a-6d (9-1/2" square unfinished).









 Refer to Throw Quilt Layout (Page 4) for arrangement and placement of blocks and borders.

 Arrange blocks into 7 rows. Stitch into rows.
 Sew rows together to complete quilt center (45-1/2" x 63-1/2" unfinished).

 Stitch Fabric K 2-1/4" x 63-1/2" borders to right and left sides of quilt center. Add Fabric K 2-1/4" x 49" borders to top and bottom of quilt center.

10. Fold **Fabric J** 1-1/4"x 67" and 1-1/4"x 49" strips in half lengthwise, right sides out forming 5/8" wide flat piping strips.

11. Baste 5/8" x 67" Fabric J flat piping strips on top of sides of quilt, with raw edges even with outer edges of Fabric K border. Baste 5/8" x 49" Fabric J flat piping on top of top and bottom of quilt, with raw edges even with outer edges of Fabric K border.


12. Center Fabric B 4-1/2"x 79" borders on right and left sides of quilt center and

Fabric B 4-1/2" x 61" borders on top and bottom of quilt center with top of stripe next to quilt

center. Stitch borders to sides starting and stopping 1/4" from corners of quilt center. Do not trim. Press borders out, leaving folded

Fabric J strips on Fabric K borders.

13. Working with 1 corner at a time, fold the quilt right sides together so the outside edges of the borders line up. Using a 45-degree ruler, mark from the end of border seams to outer edges of borders. Stitch along marked line. Trim seam allowance to 1/4". Press corner seam open. Repeat on remaining corners.



2"x 60" borders to top and bottom of quilt.

 The quilt measures approximately 60" x 78" (unfinished). Make backing (Fabric H) approximately 8" larger than the top.

 Layer and baste top, batting, and backing together. Quilt as desired. Attach binding (Fabric N) and enjoy!!

3. Cut the following for Wall Quilt:

Fabric A - PLEASE NOTE: Panels do not always print the size intended. For this pattern, the panel has a coping border added then trimmed so the panel will fit the quilt correctly.

Fussy cut 1/4" beyond outside edges of panel to approximately 23-1/4" x 42-1/4"

Fabric B - Referring to the quilt image, fussy cut strips, the length of fabric parallel to selvage: (2) 5-3/4" x 45-1/2" scenic stripe borders

- Fabric I Cut (1) 3-3/4" strip, subcut (9) 3-3/4" squares then cut in half diagonally twice for 36 triangles
- Cut (2) 3-3/8" strips, subcut (18) 3-3/8" squares [then cut in half diagonally for 36 triangles] and (6) 1-3/8" squares
- Cut (1) 2-1/8" strip, subcut (18) 2-1/8" squares then cut in half diagonally for 36 triangles
- Cut (5) 2" strips, sewn together end to end and cut into (2) 2" x 48-1/2" and (2) 2" x 46-1/4" borders
- Cut (1) 1-3/8" strip, subcut (30) 1-3/8" squares
- Fabric L Cut (2) 2-5/8" strips, subcut (2) 2-5/8" x 24" borders
 - Cut (3) 2-1/4" strips, sewn together end to end and cut into (2) 2-1/4" x 46-1/2" borders
- Fabric M Cut (1) 3-3/4" strip, subcut (9) 3-3/4" squares then cut in half diagonally twice for 36 triangles
- Cut (2) 3-3/8" strips, subcut (18) 3-3/8" squares [then cut in half diagonally for 36 triangles] and (6) 1-3/8" squares Cut (6) 2-1/2" strips (binding)
- Cut (1) 2-1/8" strip, subcut (18) 2-1/8" squares then cut in half diagonally for 36 triangles
- Cut (1) 1-3/8" strip, subcut (30) 1-3/8" squares


Fabrics I and M squares and triangles are sewn together without regard to orientation of stripes.

4. Piecing Order for Wall Quilt:

- Arrange 2 each Fabrics I and M 1-3/8" squares in 2 rows. Sew into rows. Sew rows together. Make a total of 18 Unit 1 (2-1/4" square unfinished).
- M 1 Unit 1 Make 18
- Stitch 2 each Fabrics I and M 2-1/8" triangles to sides of a Unit 1 as shown. Make a total of 18 Unit 2 (3" square unfinished).



- 3. Stitch 2 each **Fabrics I** and **M** 3-3/4" triangles to sides of a Unit 2 as shown. Make a total of 18 Unit 3 (4" square unfinished).
- Unit 3
 Make 18
- Stitch 2 each Fabrics I and M 3-3/8" triangles to sides of a Unit 3 as shown. Make a total of 18 Blocks (5-1/2" square unfinished).




Block – Make 18

- Refer to Wall Quilt Layout (Page 5) for arrangement and placement of panel, blocks, and borders.
- Stitch Fabric L 2-5/8"x 24" strips to sides of the Fabric A panel. Trim strip ends even. Add 2-1/4" x 46" Fabric L strips to top and bottom of panel. Trim bordered panel to 25-3/4" x 45-1/2" (unfinished).
- 7. Arrange 9 blocks on top and bottom of the bordered panel as shown. Stitch blocks into rows (5-1/2" x 45-1/2" unfinished) and sew to top and bottom of bordered panel.
- Add Fabric B 5-3/4" x 45-1/2" borders to top and bottom of quilt.
- 9. Stitch **Fabric I** 2" x 46-1/4" borders to right and left sides of quilt. Add **Fabric I** 2" x 48-1/2" borders to top and bottom of quilt.
- 10. The quilt measures approximately 48-1/2" x 49-1/4" (unfinished). Make backing (**Fabric G**) approximately 8" larger than the top.
- Layer and baste top, batting, and backing together. Quilt as desired. Attach binding (Fabric M) and enjoy!!


