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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

two 6-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

seven 6-1/2" squares

one 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

four 3-1/2" squares

From Fabric B, cut:

one 7-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

one 7-1/4" square for the flying geese

Trim the remainder of the strip to 6-1/2" wide, then subcut:

five 6-1/2" squares

one 6-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

five 6-1/2" squares, for a total of ten

four 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

eight 3-1/2" x 15-1/2" rectangles

From Fabric C, cut:

two 6-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

four 6-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles

eight 4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

seventy-two 4" squares for the HSTs

five 3-7/8" x WOF strips. Subcut:

forty-eight 3-7/8" squares for the flying geese

twenty-one 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twenty 3-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles

four 3-1/2" x 15-1/2" rectangles

eight 3-1/2" x 18-1/2" rectangles

eight 3-1/2" x 36-1/2" rectangles

From Fabric D, cut:

one 7-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

three 7-1/4" squares for the flying geese

three 4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twenty-four 4" squares for the HSTs

From Fabric E. cut:

one 7-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

three 7-1/4" squares for the flying geese

one 7" x WOF strip. Subcut:

four 7" squares

one 6-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:

four 6-1/2" squares

five 4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

forty-eight 4" squares for the HSTs

From Fabric F, cut:

one 7-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:

two 7-1/4" squares for the flying geese

From Fabric G, cut:

one 7-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut: three 7-1/4" squares for the flying geese

From Fabric H, cut:

one 7" x WOF strip. Subcut: four 7" squares

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Half-Square Triangles

Step 1: Pair a 4" Fabric A square with a 4" Fabric D square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3-1/2" square. Repeat to make forty-eight A/D HSTs.



Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make ninety-six A/E HSTs.



Step 3: Repeat Step 1 with the 7" Fabric E and 7" Fabric H squares to make eight 6-1/2" E/H HSTs.



Assemble the Star Blocks

Step 4: Gather: one 6-1/2" Fabric A square four A/D HSTs eight A/E HSTs

Arrange as shown, noting the fabric placement and orientation of the HSTs. Sew the HSTs together to form rows and pairs, pressing the seams open, before finally sewing the units together in three rows.



The resulting block should measure 12-1/2" square. Repeat to make six Star Blocks with Fabric A center squares and six Star Blocks with Fabric B center squares.








Star Block with Fabric B Center Square

Assemble the Flying Geese

Step 5: Pin two 3-7/8" Fabric C squares in opposing corners of a 7-1/4" Fabric B square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.


Step 6: Sew scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.





Step 7: Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.

Step 8: Place one 3-7/8" Fabric C square at the corner of sewn block unit. Draw diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along diagonal line, creating two identical units.



Step 9: Press the seam toward smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" if necessary. Repeat to make four B/C flying geese blocks.



Step 10: Repeat with all remaining 3-7/8" Fabric C squares and 7-1/4" Fabric D-G squares to make a total of:



twelve D/C flying geese



twelve E/C flying geese




eight F/C flying geese



twelve G/C flying geese

Step 11: Gather: three G/C flying geese two F/C flying geese three E/C flying geese three D/C flying geese one B/C flying geese

Sew together along the long edges, forming a row. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the diagram. Press the seams in one direction. Repeat to make a total of four flying geese rows.



Assemble the Center Star Blocks

Step 12: Gather:

one 6-1/2" Fabric B square

two E/H HSTs

one 6-1/2" Fabric E square


one 3-1/2" x 12-1/2" Fabric C rectangle

one 3-1/2" x 15-1/2" Fabric C rectangle

two 3-1/2" x 15-1/2" Fabric B rectangles

one 3-1/2" Fabric A square

Sew the block together, as shown, noting the fabric placement and block orientation. Press the seams away from the HSTs and toward the outer C and B rectangles. The block should measure 18-1/2" square. Repeat to make four.



Assemble the Quilt


Step 13: Gather:

one Fabric A Star Block one Fabric B Star Block

two 3-1/2" x 12-1/2" Fabric C rectangles

two 3-1/2" x 36-1/2" Fabric C rectangles

one 6-1/2" x 12-1/2" Fabric C rectangles



Sew together, as shown, pressing the seams toward the Fabric C rectangles. Repeat to make a total of four units like this.

Step 14: Gather:

one Fabric A Star Block two 3-1/2" x 12-1/2" Fabric C rectangles two 3-1/2" x 18-1/2" Fabric C rectangles

Sew together, as shown, pressing the seams toward the Fabric C rectangles. Repeat to make a total of four units like this: two with Fabric A centers and two with Fabric B centers.





Step 15: Arrange the units together to form the quilt top, as shown. Note the fabric placement and block orientation. Sew together in rows, pressing the seams to one side. Sew the rows together to form the quilt top. Press.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
