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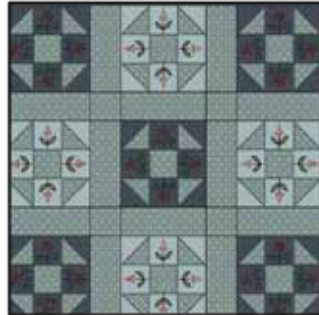

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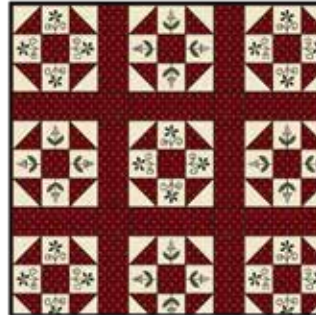

½ yard	Novelty Scatter - Red (B)	2228-88
⅞ yard	Novelty Scatter - Green (C)	2228-66
¼ yard	Daisy Stitches - Butternut (D)	2230-34
¼ yard	Scissors - Cream (E)	2229-44
¾ yard	Daisy Stitches - Red (F)	2230-88*
½ yard	Scissors - Blue (G)	2229-17
¼ yard	Novelty Scatter - Navy (H)	2228-77
⅞ yard	Border Stripe - Cream (I)	2231-44
⅜ yard	Daisy Stitches - Cream (J)	2230-44
3 yards	Hexies - Red (Backing)	2227-88

\*Includes binding

### Cutting Instructions

*Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

#### From the Home Sewn Panel - Cream (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 22 ½" x 42 ½" panel.

#### From the Novelty Scatter - Red (B), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x 42 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 2 ½" x 26 ½" strips.

#### From the Novelty Scatter - Green (C), cut:

- (2) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 3" x 7 ¼" strips.
- (3) 3" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3" x 59" strips.
- (3) 3" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3" x 44" strips.

#### From the Daisy Stitches - Butternut (D), cut:

- (2) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 3" x 7 ¼" strips.

#### From the Scissors - Cream (E), cut:

- (2) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 3" x 7 ¼" strips.

#### From the Daisy Stitches - Red (F), cut:

- (2) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 3" x 7 ¼" strips.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Scissors - Blue (G), cut:

- (2) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 3" x 7 ¼" strips.
- (1) 3 ⅛" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 3 ⅛" squares.
- (1) 2 ¾" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 ¾" strips.

#### From the Novelty Scatter - Navy (H), cut:

- (2) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 3" x 7 ¼" strips.

#### From the Border Stripe - Cream (I):

- Fussy cut (2) 7 ¼" x 25 ½" strips each centered on a block stripe.

#### From the Daisy Stitches - Cream (J), cut:

- (2) 2 ¾" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 2 ¾" squares.
- (1) 3 ⅛" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 3 ⅛" squares.

#### From the Hexies - Red (Backing), cut:

- (2) 52" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 52" x 72" back.

### Sewing Instructions

1. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 22 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 26 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel to make the Center Block (Fig. 1 below). Trim block to measure 25 ½" x 45 ½".

2. Sew together (3) 3" x 7 ¼" Fabric C strips, (3) 3" x 7 ¼" Fabric D strips, (3) 3" x 7 ¼" Fabric E strips, (3) 3" x 7 ¼" Fabric F strips and (3) 3" x 7 ¼" Fabric H strips lengthwise to make (1) Block One strip (Fig. 2). Repeat to make a second Block Two strip.

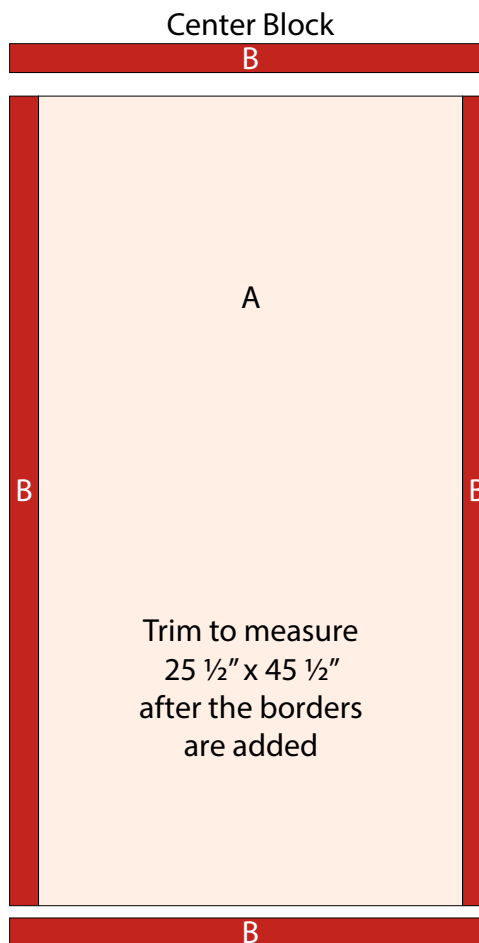

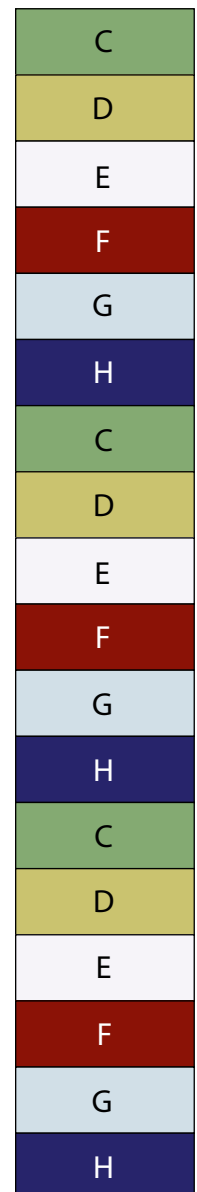

3. Place (1) 3 1/8" Fabric J square on top of (1) 3 1/8" Fabric G square, right side together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 3). Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3). Cut the two squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 4) to make two Unit 1 squares (Fig. 5). Trim units to measure 2 3/4" square. Repeat to make (16) Unit 1 squares total.

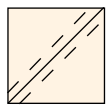

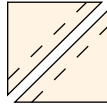

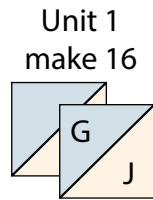

4. Sew (1) 2 3/4" Fabric J square to each side of (1) 2 3/4" Fabric G square to make (1) JGJ strip. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to each side of (1) 2 3/4" Fabric J square to make (1) Top Block Strip. Pay attention to the unit orientations. Repeat to make (1) Bottom Block Strip. Pay attention to the unit orientations. Sew the Top Block Strip and Bottom Block Strip to the top and to the bottom of the JGJ strip to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (4) Block Two squares total.

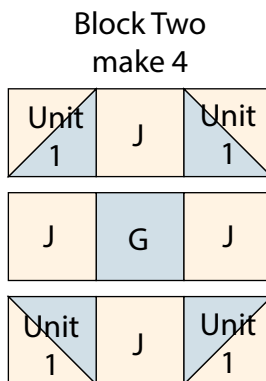

### Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the *Quilt Layout while assembling.*)

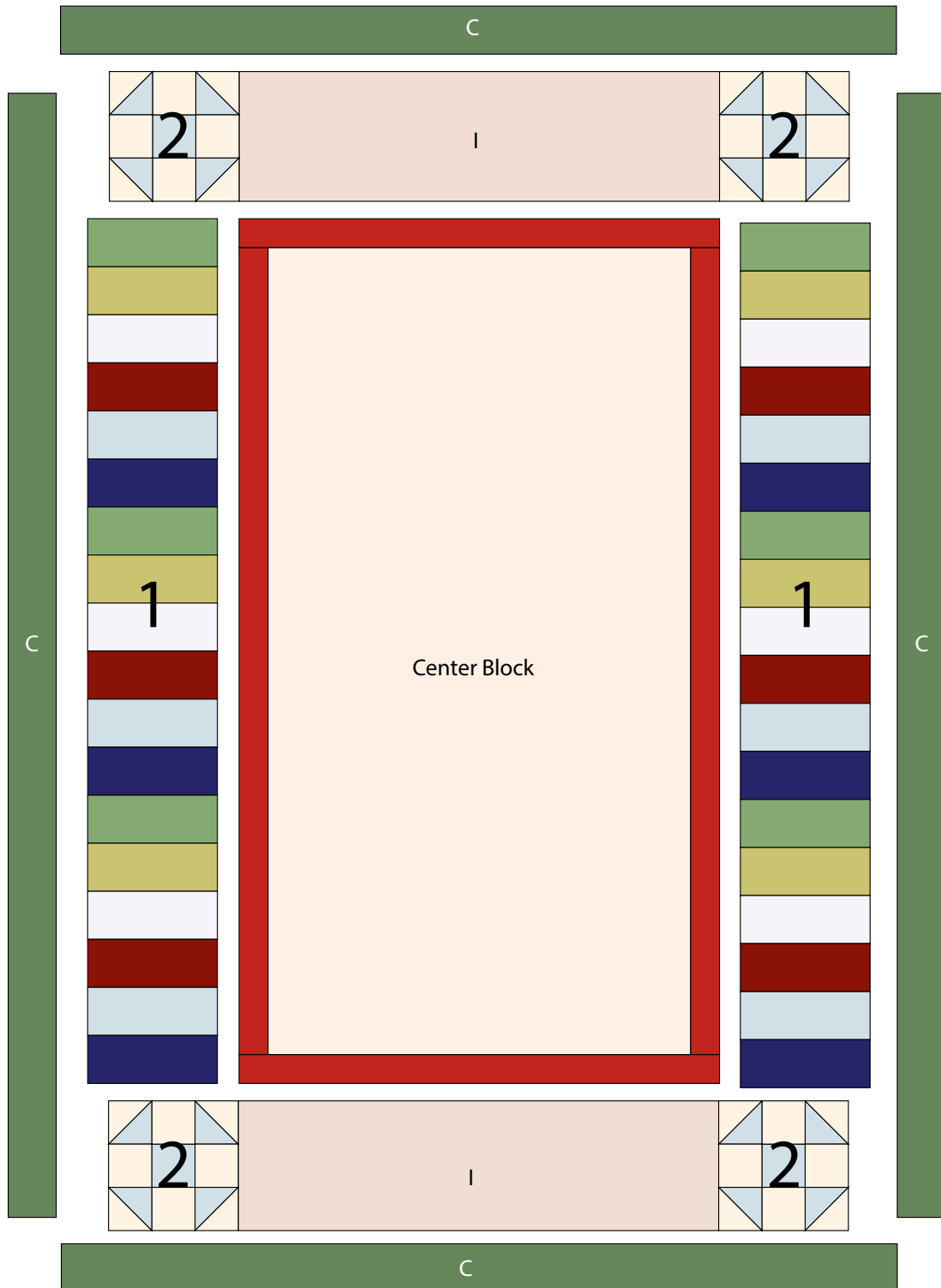
5. Sew (1) Block One strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) 7 1/4" x 25 1/2" Fabric I strip to make (1) Top Border Strip. Repeat to make (1) Bottom Border Strip. Sew the Top Border Strip and the Bottom Border Strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

6. Sew (1) 3" x 59" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 3" x 44" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

7. Layer and quilt as desired.

8. Sew the (6) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric F strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

9. Bind as desired.
