The quilt and block diagrams portrayed are virtual images. The layout and look of your project may differ when using actual fabric.

WOF = Width of Fabric

RST = Right Sides Together

SNF = Stitch and Flip

CUTTING REQUIREMENTS

- Please read instructions before cutting fabrics.
- Cutting Instructions are based on a 42" WOF.
- Refer to the quilt cover image for fabric placement.
- Use a straight edger and rotary cutter to cut fabrics.
- Label pieces as you cut.

Panel

Fussy-cut (4) large blocks from the panel to measure 16%" square each. Before cutting, ensure the design is centered.

Cut (6) 6" x WOF strips.

Bird Body

Cut (8) $4" \times 15\%"$ rectangles in the fabrics and quantities listed:

- (2) Aqua Main
- (2) Teal Plaid
- (2) Aqua Vignettes
- (1) Teal Dots
- (1) Teal Stripes

Following the Bird Body Cutting Diagram below, subcut (6) pieces from each 4" × 15½" rectangle in the order listed.



Corner Squares

Cut (11) 2½" squares from each color group. Keep the (44) total squares grouped by color, and label: CS.

Group A: Salmon Plaid, Dots, Flowers, & Vignettes

Group B: Teal Dots, Aqua Main, & Vignettes

Group C: Gray Main, Dots, Stripes, Flowers, & Birds

Group D: Lemon Vignettes, & Stripes

Bird Wing

Cut (8) 2½" × 4" rectangles in the fabrics and quantities listed below and label BW.

- (3) White Birds
- (2) White Flowers
- (1) White Dots
- (2) White Plaid


GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:

- Please read through the instructions before beginning.
- Follow the diagrams' pressing arrows for successful piecing.
- Orient the pieces according to their pertinent diagrams. Doing so is essential to following relational instructions such as top, bottom, left, right, and so on.
- The angled seams shown in the quilt are constructed using the Stitch & Flip method. This method is described next and referenced in the pattern.

Stitch & Flip Method (S&F)

- Place a square right sides together on a base square or rectangle, matching the raw edges in the corner to be replaced.
- Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the top piece across the corner.
- Sew on the drawn line.

- Trim off the corner, ¼" away from the sewn line.
- Flip the top piece away from the base and press. The original corner has been replaced and the base size remains the same.



Nine-Patch Variation & Center Block Assembly


1. Sew (2) C rectangles to opposite sides of an O square to make Unit 1 (8½" × 4½").



2. Select (4) Corner Squares—one from each color **Group** A, B, C & D. Sew (1) CS to each end of (2) C rectangles to make (2) of Unit 2 (8½" \times 2½" each).




3. Sew a Unit 2 to the top and bottom of Unit 1 to complete the Nine-Patch Variation block (8½" square).




4. Repeat Steps 1–3 to make a total of (9) blocks.

5. Select the Nine-Patch Variation block with the White Plaid center and repeat Steps 1–3 two more times, using B strips in the next round, and A strips in the final round to complete the Center Block (16%" square). Notice that each round includes a Corner Square from each color group.



Bird Block Assembly


6. Sew (5) 20" strips together lengthwise in the following order, top to bottom as shown to make a strip set:



7. Crosscut (8) 1¾" segments from the strip set to make Bird Legs (8½"× 1¾").



8. Using the S&F method, replace the top right corner of rectangle K with a Q square. Sew a rectangle L to the top to complete a Bird Beak $(1\frac{3}{4}" \times 6")$. Make 8.




- Bird Block: Choose a matching Bird Set to use in the following instructions.
- 9. Using the **S&F** method, replace the top right corner of a BW rectangle with (1) B6 square.
- 10. Using the S&F method, replace the lower left corner of the BW rectangle with (1) B4 square to complete the Bird Wing.




Bird Wing

11. Sew rectangle B2 to the left of the Bird Wing; rectangle B1 to the right $(6\%" \times 4")$.



12. Using the **S&F** method, replace the lower left corner with an I square; the lower right corner with a G square to complete Bird Unit 1 as shown.



13. Using the S&F method, replace the upper left corner of rectangle B3 with an M square; the upper right corner with a G square as shown to make a Bird Head.





14. Using the S&F method, replace the lower right corner of rectangle H with a B5 square as shown to complete the Bird Tail.




Bird Tail


15. Sew the Bird Tail to the right side of the Bird Head to complete Bird Unit 2 ($6\frac{3}{4}$ " × $2\frac{1}{2}$ ").



16. Sew Bird Unit 2 to the top of Bird Unit 1 to make Bird Unit 3 (6¾" × 6").




- 17. Sew a Bird Beak to the left side of Bird Unit 3; strip N to the right side (8½" \times 6").
- 18. Sew strip J to the top of Bird Unit 3; the Bird Legs to the bottom, making sure the longer D section is oriented to the left, to complete the Bird Block (8½" square).




19. Repeat Steps 4–13 to make a total of (8) Bird blocks.

Corner Block Assembly

1. Sew a Nine-Patch Variation block to the left side of a Bird block to make an A Row (8½" × 16½"). Make (4) A Rows.




2. Sew a Nine-Patch Variation block to the right side of a Bird block to make a B Row (8½" × 16½"). Make (4) B Rows.




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3. Sew an A Row to the top of a B Row to make a C Corner Block (16%" square). Make (2).



4. Sew a B Row to the top of an A Row to make a D Corner Block (16½" square). Make (2).



Quilt Assembly

1. Arrange (4) Fussy-Cut Blocks, (1) Center Block, (2) C Corner Blocks, and (2) D Corner Blocks into a 3 × 3 setting. C & D Corner Blocks will lie diagonally across from each other as shown.

2. Sew Blocks together in rows of (3). Sew rows together to complete the quilt center (48½" square).



Border Assembly

Refer to the Quilt Layout Diagram on page 6 for border construction.

- 3. Sew (5) Teal Dots WOF strips together end-to-end.
- 4. Cut (2) vertical inner borders from the strip, each 48½" long. Sew one to each side of the quilt center $(52\%" \times 48\%")$.
- 5. From the remaining strip, cut (2) horizontal inner borders, each 52½" long. Sew (1) to the top and (1) to the bottom of the quilt center (52½" square).
- 6. Sew (6) White Main WOF strips together end-to-end.
- 7. From the strip cut (2) vertical outer borders, each 52½" long. Sew one to each side of the quilt $(63\frac{1}{2}" \times 52\frac{1}{2}")$.
- 8. From the strip cut (2) horizontal outer borders, each 63½" long. Sew (1) to the top and (1) to the bottom of the quilt. Quilt should measure 63½" x 63½".

Finishing

Finish your quilt by layering the quilt top, batting and backing. Quilt as desired. Bind with (7) 2½" x WOF Teal Dots strips.
